Give a homeless person hope to hold on to!

Operation Hope Tote is Open Door Mission's Christian outreach that provides an opportunity for caring groups like yours to give real help to struggling, homeless men, women and children in the Heartland area.

Hope Totes are small plastic bags your group members fill with inexpensive items like shampoo, toothpaste and warm, clean socks. These basic supplies can make a big difference in the way homeless people live—and feel about themselves.

Operation Hope Tote is a simple but powerful way to help homeless people, and to express Christ's love and the spirit of renewal that is such an important part of Easter.

What to put in a Hope Tote

You can give homeless people hope to hold on to by filling Hope Totes with new, unopened products, including:

- Toothbrush and toothpaste
- Shaving cream
- Shampoo and conditioner
- Deodorant
- Underwear
- Socks
- Brush and comb
- Pain relievers—ibuprofen and acetaminophen
- Non-alcoholic cough medicines
- Hand or body lotion
- Disposable razors
